BRIEF HISTORY OF THE COLLEGE

Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College has a brilliant history to boast of. It was formerly known as Victoria College. As a seat of learning, it has a glorious past. As Cooch Behar has a legacy of education since an eon, this college is sure to have a memory-trove to cash in on, no doubt. Way back in 1888, Maharaja Nripendra Narayan, who was an enthusiast in expanding learning in this region, built this college in the bustling central hub of the town of Cooch Behar.

The first Principal of this College was J.D. Goodley and the first Indian who graced the chair of the Principal was the erudite Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal. For eighteen long years (1896-1913) he was at the helm of the affairs of this college. An ardent lover of books, this scholarly principal was also a perfect academician and administrator. Under the aegis of Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal, the College had provisions for teaching post graduate courses in English Language and Literature and Philosophy. Even Law formed an appendage to it.

After the merging of the Princely State of Coochbehar with India, The Government of West Bengal took up the responsibility of running this institution. Thus this college earned the status of a Government College. In 1970 this institution was renamed as Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College to commemorate the saintly principal's contribution. Since its nascence, it won a pride of place in the map of learning under the University of Calcutta. Of late, it is an eminent seat of learning under the University of North Bengal. One can easily take pride in the fact that the flambeau of learning is still aflame. Hundreds of students from various nooks and corners of North Bengal file in every year seeking admission into this college. This century old college is alma-mater of hundreds of well-placed academicians, both in this country and abroad. Eminent professors would take great delight in teaching here. Needless to say this educational institution is still playing a significant role in disseminating higher education into the dark crannies of North Bengal. It is our pleasure and pride that the college is successfully running post-graduate studies in Bengali, Sanskrit and Zoology since 2004 and History since 2010. The college as recently obtained another feather of pride to its glorified crown— the recognition by UGC as a Centre with Potential for Excellence.

COURSE OF STUDY

This college offers both Under Graduate and Post-Graduate courses. Under Graduate courses are offered in two faculties' viz. Science and Arts, whereas Post-Graduate courses are offered in the departments of Bengali, Sanskrit and History under the faculty of Arts and Zoology under the Faculty of Science.

POST GRADUATE COURSE

- **2-year M.Sc. course in Zoology and 2-year M.A. course in Bengali, History and Sanskrit** are offered to the students who have completed their under graduate degree course with Honours in the respective subjects.
 - There are **31 seats in Bengali, History and Sanskrit** and **28 seats in Zoology**. The admission to those subjects will follow the Cooch Behar Panchanan Barma University (C.B.P.B.U.) Guidelines in this regard.
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- **28% seats (22% for SC and 6% for ST) and 17% seats (10% for OBC-A and 7% for OBC-B)** in each subject shall be kept reserved for those category students who will be eligible for admission. If the number of eligible ST candidates falls short of the reserved quota, the vacancies will be filled up by eligible SC candidates and vice-versa. If the number of SC/ST candidates falls short of the quota for them, the candidates of general category may fill up the vacancies after observing necessary procedures.
- **3% of the seats** shall be reserved for physically handicapped candidates having not less than 40% disabilities subject to production of medical certificates from appropriate authorities.

UNDER GRADUATE COURSES

- **3-year B.Sc. (Core/Honours) courses** in six Science subjects such as **Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Zoology, Botany and Physiology** are offered to the students passing the H.S. or equivalent examination with requisite marks and combinations.
 - **3-year B.A. (Core/Honours) courses** in three Languages such as **Bengali, English and Sanskrit** are offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations with requisite marks and combination.
 - **3-years B.A. (Core/Honours) courses** in five Arts subjects such as **History, Political Science, Philosophy, Geography and Economics** are offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations with requisite marks and combination.
 - **The requirement of mathematics as a subject at the Higher Secondary or equivalent level for admission to under graduate Honours course in Economics will be waived with effect from 2016-17 academic session. Honours students of Economics having Mathematics as a General subject will be awarded B.Sc. degree and Honours students of Economics who doesn't have Mathematics as a General subject will be awarded B. A. Degree.**
 - **3-year B.Sc. (General) in Science Stream** is offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations with requisite marks and combination.
 - **3-year B.A. (General)** is offered to the students passing H.S. or equivalent examinations with requisite marks and combination.
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COURSE OF STUDY (Academic Session: 2017-2018)

[According to Draft Regulation relating to UG course of studies and examinations, including BBA & BCA of CBPBU]

There shall be two courses of studies leading to BA/BSc/BCom Degree and each course shall be of six semesters duration. One shall be termed as “BA/BSc/BCom Honours” and the other “BA/BSc/BCom Program”.

The admission to UG Degree courses will be governed by the guidelines of the university and the Higher Education Department of Govt. of West Bengal as framed from time to time.

A Candidate shall be allowed to pursue any one of the Undergraduate Degree programs of the University (not more than one) at a time.

Type of Courses

Different courses of study are labeled and defined as follows :

- A) **Core Courses (CC) and Department Specific Core (DSC) courses** – These courses which should compulsorily be studied by a student as a core requirement in the mother discipline. Fourteen Core Courses are offered for Honours students of a particular subject. Four Department Specific Core Courses are offered of a particular discipline which has been opted by a student of a Regular Program. Another type of Department Specific Core Courses may be named as **Language Core Courses (LCC)** which are meant for only Program (For B.A./B.Com) Courses. The main purpose of these courses is to enhance the language skill including English and so as to increase their chances of employment.
- B) **Elective Courses** – A Candidate would opt for two types of electives. An elective course that a student would choose from a pool of courses from the main discipline/subject of study and in which the student will be specially knowledgeable is named as **Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE)**. On the other hand when a student would choose a course from unrelated discipline from a pool of courses offered by other departments may be termed as **Generic Elective (GE)**. A Honours student opt for four such DSE courses which will be taught in fifth and sixth semester and four such GE courses which will be taught in first consecutive four semesters.
- C) **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)** – These comprises **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)** and **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC)** – for the purpose of skill enhancement of student in respect with his/her selected subject/study and to widen the job opportunity in the global market SEC courses are introduced. And for the purpose of the personality development of the student and to enhance soft skill, a student would be **compulsorily taught English/MIL and Environmental studies as AECC courses**.

Core and Elective courses are of 6 (six) credit each and Ability Enhancement courses are of 2 (two) credit each excluding Environmental Studies (ENVS) which is of 4 (four) credit. Thus a student of Honours course has to pursue 142 credits in six semesters and similarly a student of regular course has to complete 122 credits.

CBPBU Regulations Relating Admission to Degree Classes (Honours / General)

1.a) Those candidates who would obtain either (i) 55% marks in the aggregate or (ii) 50% in the aggregate with 60% marks in the subject in the qualifying examinations shall be eligible to apply for admission to Honours Course in the subject concerned in general (Un-Reserved) category.. Admission to a course shall be subject to availability of seats and based on merit.

Provided that for SC/ST candidates, the minimum marks for eligibility shall be (i) 50% marks in the aggregate or (ii) 45% in the aggregate with 60% in the subject for admission to Honours Course in the subject concerned. We also preserve the admission facilities for the students belonging to OBC-A and OBC-B categories.

For all laboratory based subjects, the student must have passed in that subject at 10+2 level, if that subject exists in the HS subject list, or equivalent subject if it does not exist in the HS list of subjects, as per existing NBU admission guidelines.

b) Admission to all Honours Courses will be based strictly on merit. Merit shall be calculated as per the following formula :

$$\text{Merit} = (2S + T) / 6$$

T = marks obtained in English + marks obtained in the subject opted for Honours (S)+ best marks of other two subjects (excluding EVS, the subject opted for Hons & English) and
S = Marks obtained in the subject opted for Honours.

c) i) If the candidate does not have the specific subject opted for Honours in his/her previous course, the procedure for Merit Calculation will be as follows :

$$\text{Merit} = T_1 / 4$$

T₁ = marks obtained in English + best marks of other three subjects (excluding EVS & English)

ii) This procedure is also applicable in case of admission to General Course i.e.

$$\text{Merit} = T_1 / 4$$

d) For admission to the B.A. (Hons), B.Sc (Hons) & B.Com (Hons) Courses, SC or ST candidates getting admission should have in the previous examinations qualifying marks which are not lower by more than 25% from the marks obtained by the last candidate of the general category. The candidates included in the general merit list will not be counted towards these reserved quotas.

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A single Merit List is to be prepared taking applicants from all recognized Boards together.
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2. **Every student shall have to attend at least 75% of the classes actually held in a year / session to sit for any University Examination (Part-I/II/III).**

The council also resolved that “all students of Higher Secondary (Vocational) Course [X+2 level] will be treated as equivalent with the course curriculum and syllabus of the WEST BENGAL COUNCIL OF HIGHER SECONDARY EDUCATION (WBCHSE) W.E.F. the session 2009-2010.” Such students shall be admitted only in the 1st Year General Course of B.A. / B. Sc./ B. Com. Vide memo no. 70/UG-15 (62) dated 29.05.2015.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Application for admission in the college should be made in prescribed **ONLINE APPLICATION FORM AVAILABLE AT THE COLLEGE WEBSITE: abnscollege.org** and go “Online Admission System Candidate Interface Manual”

MORNING SECTION

The College runs a Morning Section too in which General (Pass) courses/Program Course of B.A/B.Sc. are taught by the Part-time teachers with meticulous care.

REGISTRATION

After admission every student is required to get himself/herself registered with the C.B.P.B.U. Admission of a student migrating from an academic board or university other than the West Bengal Council of Higher Secondary Education or the C.B.P.B.U. remains provisional and as such is liable to cancellation, if the migration certificate and other necessary documents are not submitted in due time or the C.B.P.B.U. does not approve the migration.

IDENTITY CARD

After admission to the College each student is entitled to get an identity card signed by the Principal and it is a proof of his/her status as a student of this College. Students are required to bring their identity card with them to College and produce it as and when necessary. Loss of identity card must be reported immediately to the office and will be replaced on payment of charges for the same. In case of transfer or withdrawal from the college, the card must be surrendered at the College office.

ATTENDANCE

Name of the student will be struck off if he/she fails to attend 75% of the classes held during the first 15 days of the new academic session. Attendance of at least 75% of the classes held during the course of study is necessary as eligibility for appearing at the University examinations. Students failing the requirement of minimum attendance will not be allowed to appear at the University Examination.

GENERAL RULES

- Students must be punctual and regular in attending classes.
- They should come to the college decently attired. Their class under no circumstances should be unbecoming of a student attending an educational Institution.
- Students must consult the College Notice board everyday, failing which the College authority will not be responsible for any inconvenience faced by them
- Students are required to attend all extra-curricular activities organized by the institution.

DISCIPLINE

- Admission to the college binds a student to observe college rules and all directives that may be issued from time to time by College authority.
 - Loitering and lounging on the corridors are strictly prohibited.
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- Students shall take proper care of the college furniture and must not tamper with it at its premises and must not spoil or cause any deliberate damage or tamper with the College property, furniture, fittings etc.
- Students shall leave their bicycles, scooters or motorcycle in the shed provided for this purpose. No bicycles, scooters or motorcycles shall be parked in any other part of the College premises.
- As per recent Govt. directive and verdict of the apex court vis-à-vis campus ragging in any form, physical or mental, has been totally banned within and outside the College premises.
- Passing Improper comments about anybody and eve teasing of all forms are strictly prohibited.

LIBRARY

This college itself has a well-equipped library located in a separate building in the college premises. It has a Reference section; a lending section and a Reading Room. The reference section has books on diverse subjects including encyclopedias, valuable dictionaries of current editions, year book, bibliographies etc. It also subscribes to various periodicals. At present, the library has over 75,000 volumes. The wide and spacious reading room gives the students the right kind of ambience for consulting/reading/browsing through these books from the library against their library card which is issued to students soon after their admission. In addition to the central Library each department runs respective departmental seminar libraries providing easy access of books to the students.

NCC

In order to inculcate an integral attitude towards life, the role of NCC is overly significant. Admission to the NCC is open to all students of the college. Every year cadets pass the NCC "B" and "C" certificate examinations. They attend various NCC camps in West Bengal and outside as part of the NCC programme. They also participate in the Republic Day parade in New Delhi every year. Between 2007 and 2015 sixty cadets have been employed in defence services and other departments.

NSS

The College also has a very active NSS wing, which performs laudable activities to help the students grow into better responsible citizens of tomorrow. Cultural, social and humanitarian activities are regular affair with the NSS of this College. The NSS unit holds social service camps in rural areas where students and teachers work in collaboration with local youths. Usually the programme includes road construction, road repairing, cleaning of college campus, cleaning of water tanks, plantation of saplings organizing health check up camps, particularly in pulse polio immunization programme, cultural programmes, observing World's Aids day, Anti leprosy day etc. For the past few years the NSS unit of this College adopted a nearby village Dakshin Khagrabari for all these social welfare activities. Every year the NSS unit in collaboration with West Bengal Voluntary Blood Donors' Association organizes a blood donation camp in the College premises.

STIPENDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Apart from the National Scholarships won by the students individually, the financially backward students are entitled to get succor from an AID Fund run by the teachers of this College. Besides the SC/ST are liable to get an exemption in payment of fees.

GAMES AND EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

The College play ground measuring about 10,000 sq.m.is well maintained. Each year annual sports meet is a pompous and gala event of this College. The students for over more than three decades are participating in various competitions. They have won

laurels in this state-level competition too. Outdoor games like Football and Cricket etc. are held in the playground. Physical education department of the College looks after the progress of sportsperson. The College team regularly participates in the inter-Govt. College and inter-university Football and Cricket Tournaments and Athletic meets. The College provides ample scope for development of an integrated personality and it has keen interest in promoting co-curricular activities of the students. Each year competitions are held in various events like debates, music, song, extempore speech, quiz etc among the students of this College.

STUDENTS' UNION

As per Government rules and the University statute, the college has a students' union. The members of this union are elected annually from and by the students of this College .The students' union takes the responsibility of organizing Fresher's Welcome for newly admitted students, common room activities, and cultural programmes of this College etc. Every year the Annual Social of the College '**NABARUN**' is also organized under the leadership of the students' union of this College.

HOSTEL FACILITIES

There are two separate hostels of this college, one for Boys and other for Girls. The Girl and Boy students who come from far-off nook of this region may seek admission to either Acharya B. N.Seal College Girls' Hostel or Nipendra Narayan Memorial Boys' Hostel respectively subject to the availability of seats.

Nripendra Narayan Memorial Boys' Hostel

The college Boys' Hostel is a residence of meritorious students from distant regions of the district. The life in this hostel develops academic intelligence as well as social consciousness and creativity of mind.The first students' protest against military autocracy was initiated by the boarders during the BritishRaj on 8th August, 1946. The hostel building is a unique piece of traditional architecture in the skyline of Coochbehar. It is compulsory for all students to vacate their hostel seats after three years from the time of admission. This period will not be extended under any circumstances.

Sister Nebedita Girls' Hostel

A.B.N Seal College Girls' Hostel is meant for regular female students of this college. Boarders must obey the following rules and regulations as also those which the Principal of the college or the Superintendent of the hostel may enforce from time to time. The rules laid down here, come into force with immediate effect. It is compulsory for all students to vacate their hostel seats after three years from the time of admission. This period will not be extended under any circumstances.

HOSTEL ADMISSION NORMS:

Regular students of A. B. N. Seal College, Cooch Behar are eligible for admission to these hostels. Admission will be for a full university session (i.e. from June-May). Application for admission to the hostel should be submitted to the college/hostel office in a prescribed form within a fixed date, to be notified by college/hostel office. Admission to the hostel as boarder is strictly done on the basis of distance and merit. Each application should be accompanied by-

- i. Certificates of good conduct from the superintendant of hostel last resided/ from the Head

of the institution last attended/ a respectable person of the locality.

- ii. Self attested copy of the mark sheet of the last examination passed.
- iii. Distance certificate from M. L. A./Gram Panchayet/ S. D. O./ B. D. O./ Chairman of Municipality.

REMEDIAL COACHING CENTRE FOR SC/ST STUDENTS

A remedial coaching centre for the students belonging to SC, ST and other weaker sections of the society started functioning since 1998 at this college, under the sponsorship and the approval of the UGC. It provides facilities for special coaching classes to the candidates belonging to SC, ST and other backward communities.

COACHING CENTRE (ENTRY LEVEL)

The college provides special coaching for NET and SET examinations as well as WBCS and SSC under the sponsorship of UGC. With the help of our wise and esteemed faculty members (namely the departments of Zoology, Bengali, History and Sanskrit) willing students are provided coaching free of cost.

CAREER COUNSELLING COMMITTEE

This UGC sponsored centre arranges Career Counselling for the students where various companies recruit employees according to their needs.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CENTRE

The UGC sponsored centre caters to the needs of the female students as well as students from SC, ST and minority sections, who are economically backward by helping them in fixing their objectives with the help and guidance of the District Industrial Centre and private local entrepreneurs in different streams.

STUDENT PROJECT

The student project is targeted towards advanced learners. Advanced and promising 2nd Year and 3rd Year students get a chance to run a funded project as a part of this endeavour.

INSTITUTE VISIT

This activity like the student project activity is meant for advanced learners. The college arranges for a tour of advanced and meritorious students to reputed institutes for a first hand practical knowledge and necessary research experience in both science and humanity disciplines.

EDUCATIONAL TOURS

Each department organize educational tours for all students. These tours are both educative and entertaining for the students.

COMPUTER LEARNING PROGRAMME

The college arranges for basic level computer training programmes for interested students. The programme is monitored by informed and experienced teaching faculties. The computer cell of the college has the necessary infrastructure to provide hands on training to the participating students.

PG ENTRANCE GUIDANCE CENTRE

This centre trains students for competitive PG entrance examinations of various elite institutes in India, provides necessary preparatory materials, issues books and question banks and holds regular classes.

DISTANCE EDUCATION STUDY CENTRE

A study centre (NO. 2812) of Indira Gandhi National Open University, a central university, has been set up at this college since 1993 and has a distinction for being the first centre in such a distant region of North Bengal. This study centre provides UG as well as PG programmes of IGNOU to its learners.

Besides, in about 17 (certificate and diploma) courses, this study centre is qualified enough to impart lessons and issue certificates and diplomas to its learners. From a humble beginning with 100 students, this study centre of IGNOU caters to the professional and academic needs for over 400 students every year.

A study centre of the University of Burdwan under the Directorate of Distance Education has been established in the year 2013 and has a distinction for being the first centre in such a distant region of North Bengal. This study centre provides PG programmes in Bengali, English, History, Sanskrit and Philosophy.

WOMEN'S CELL

This guidance and counselling centre for women students under lady teachers interact with the female students on various socio-economic and cultural barriers faced by women.

ALUMNI ASSOCIATION

Very recently the A B N Seal College Alumni Association has been formed, Registered under the societies Registration Act, 1860 and onward amendments. It serves as a platform to bring together the former students who are willing to contribute towards the academic and material advancement of their alma mater with their physical and intellectual labour as well as material support. All former students and teachers of the college are eligible to become members of this association against the payment of the requisite membership fee. Since its inception the Alumni Association has been actively involved in the development of the college by sponsoring various renovation and beautification projects across the campus. A Certificate Course in Value-Education for the students of the college has also been launched by the college in collaboration with the Alumni Association.

A B N SEAL COLLEGE PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION

The A B N Seal College parent-teacher association has been formed in 2016 as a registered trust under the Societies Registration Act of 1860 (and onwards amendments). The parents of each student taking admission to the college will become members of this Association against the payment of the membership fee. As a bridge between the college authorities and the parent stakeholders this Association aims to create a forum whereby the parents can communicate their views about the functioning of the college and thus facilitate further improvement. As an autonomous body with a fund generated through the membership fees the ABNSPTA has also been able to supplement and sponsor various development projects of the college. One major contribution of the Parent-Teacher Association has been the formation of a fund for providing financial assistance to underprivileged students who do not enjoy any financial aid from the agencies.

HEALTH CENTRE

The college has its own Health Care Centre. The college conducts a bi-weekly routine check up of the students of this college by a qualified part time doctor deputed by CMOH, Coochbehar. The college maintains health insurance schemes for each student for a period of 3/5 years.

COMPUTER CELL

A computer literacy cell has been functioning in the college since the last couple of years to acclimatize the students with the changing global scenario.

UGC NETWORKING SYSTEM

Under the sponsorship of UGC the college runs its networking system with broadband facility. The students of this college can search the internet at the time allotted to them. The college has access to various online journals of international repute through JSTOR and INFLIBNET for both teachers and students.

MEMORIAL LECTURES

Memorial lectures are organized for the benefit of the students in each department. This activity brings a reputed luminary of a particular discipline face to face with the students of the department, where she/he lectures on relevant issues within the field of the students' academic curriculum.
