

According to WTO, 'Intellectual Property Rights' (IPR) are the rights given to persons over the creations of their minds. They usually give the creator an exclusive right over the use of his/her creation for a certain period of time. There are several types of intellectual property protection like patent, copyright, trademark, etc. Technological progress requires the development and application of new inventions, while a vibrant culture will always try newer avenues to express itself. Accordingly, the right balance between the interests of innovators and the wider public interest is imminent and the IPR seek to foster an environment in which creativity and innovation can flourish. In this backdrop, a one-day national level workshop titled 'Intellectual Property Rights-Patents and Design Processes' was organized by Department of Economics, A.B.N. Seal College in association with Rajib Gandhi National Institute of Intellectual Property Management (RGNIIM), Govt. Of India on 3rd December, 2021. The Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Intellectual Property Management (RGNIIM) of Nagpur is a National centre of excellence for training, management, research and education in the field of Intellectual Property (IP) Rights. The main objectives of this institute are to cater to the need of training of Examiners of Patents, Designs, Trademarks and Geographical Indications. This pioneer institute facilitates research on IP related issues including preparation of study reports and policy analysis of relevance to Government. It also addresses the needs of increasing the general awareness and understanding of Government officers and users of IP systems including in universities and other educational institutions.

This workshop was held in online mode via Zoom platform. Students and faculty members of Economics, faculty members and students of other departments of this college, faculty members, students and research scholars of other institutes attended the workshop. The workshop commenced at 12 p.m., Dr.Joyjit Dhar, Head of the Department of Economics welcomed the august gathering and also the distinguished speaker of the day. Revered Principal of the College Dr.Nilay Ray inaugurated the seminar and delivered the inaugural speech. In his inaugural speech, Dr.Ray pointed out the rationale of organizing this workshop and how it may affect an average individual of our country in a globalized village of today. At the beginning of the technical session, Smt. Ananya Biswas, faculty member of the Department introduced the erudite speaker of the day Mrs. Pooja Maulikar. A few sentences about Mrs. Maulikar given below will speak for her proficiency and credibility in the relevant field:

Mrs. Pooja Maulikar is working as Examiner of Patents and Designs (Group A Gazetted Officer) under the Patent Office, Ministry of Commerce & Industry, Govt. Of India. She usually examines the national and international Patent applications from IPO Mumbai. She was faculty for various intellectual property training at RGNIIM, Nagpur. Besides, she has also been a part of different judicial, national and international training programmes regarding IPR practices.

The technical session started with an excellent and interactive presentation on the "Intellectual Property Rights" by Mrs. Maulikar. Her presentation began with explaining the



importance of IPR in the present scenario. Moreover, what is patent, the different tools available for patenting were also delineated in this session.

The importance to file patents and how patent can be filed were discussed in detail. Since, she is an examiner of patents she also discussed the nuances of patent filing processes. She also gave a brief idea about design process, how can it make a product commercially viable etc.



Workshop on 'Outcome-Based Education (OBE)' during July 14-15, 2021

Report on the Two-Day Online National Workshop on Outcome-Based Education (OBE)

Organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

Objectives of the Workshop

The prime objective of this workshop is to nurture the philosophy of Outcome-Based Education (OBE) and build the capacity of the Faculty Members and Academic Administrators for facilitating its institutionalization in the Teaching Learning System and other Academic Processes of the Institution. The proposed workshop will address various pros and cons such as the concept of Outcome-Based Education, OBE framework and its components, outcome and its impact on NAAC Metrics, Graduation Attributes, Educational Objectives, Programme Objectives, Programme Specific Objectives, Course Objectives and how they are interlinked with one another, COs Mapping, Guidelines for COs, Blooms Taxonomy, the methodology of restructuring the present curriculum to suit OBE etc.

The Programme at A Glance

This Two-Day workshop was consisted of three Technical Sessions. At the outset, there was a separate inaugural session where the convener delivered a welcome address and the President, namely, the Principal shared his valuable ideas and aspirations behind this programme. This session was followed by two consecutive technical sessions hyphenated by a lunch break. Both these sessions offered a detailed demonstration on the various pros and cons of the OBE. Dr. S. K. Das Mandal from IIT Kharagpur shared his expertise in both these two sessions. In the second day, there was only one Technical session where Dr. B.K. Sarkar from National Institute of Technology Meghalaya acted as the resource person. This two-day long workshop was concluded with a succinct vote of thanks by the Organizing Secretary.

Excerpts from the Technical Sessions

DAY-1: 14.07.2021 Lecture 1: Accreditation and Outcome-Based Education – Dr. S. K. Das Mandal

At the beginning the speaker offered an overview of the philosophical background of the Outcome-Based Education. Starting from the notion of 'carrying the education' as expatiated by Tagore to the ideal class room ambience and interactions, he tried to make pertinent points to locate the basic necessity of tracking the outcome of education, the lessons teachers usually impart within the familiar class room scenario. As for the speaker, the OBE is an integrated system which aims to provide a student with appropriate skill sets

to develop with by improvising the curriculum from time to time in a way that the 1:1 Teacher-Student ratio could be reached virtually. This approach can create appropriate avenues for students with myriad levels of skill and productivity without hampering the format of common curriculum for all. Dr. Das Mandal insisted upon the teachers' duty to enhance students' self -learning ability on contrary to the traditional notion of injecting so-called knowledge to their naïve minds. Therefore, OBE directly deals with the cognitive level of students. As syllabus does not uniquely define the necessity of the programmes, teachers are to convert it into outcome-based curriculum. On par with this, the vision, mission, Accreditation Attributes, Programme-, Course-, and Module outcomes are to be designed. CO (Course Outcome) and PO (Programme Outcome) Mappings have major roles to play in implementing OBE effectively.

Lecture 2: Taxonomies and Instructional Objectives - Dr. S. K. Das Mandal

This lecture by the same speaker was based on the technical taxonomies and their definitions relating to OBE. Topics which were discussed in the first lecture had been elaborated with an intensive approach here. Historical background and diachronic development of Bloom's taxonomy was discussed. Dr. Das Mandal offered an introductory blueprint for facilitating participants towards proper implementation of CO and PO. By some unequivocally devised examples he tried to make a comprehensive presentation so that different levels of attainments can be marked distinctively by the teachers.

Lecture 3: Assessment and Evaluation - Dr. S. K. Das Mandal

The third and the last lecture of the day dealt with some important issues relating to the proper attainment of defined objectives stated in Pos and Cos. This lecture revolved around direct assessment, in this case the examination process. Any examination is an assessment, a process for collecting evidence about learning competence. Therefore, in OBE framing question papers is of utmost importance. Overruling the traditional distinction between hard and easy question papers, OBE system wants it to be clear whether the question paper is valid or not. A valid question paper is question paper which is related to course outcome. On basis of this ground work, the speaker demonstrated the process of CO and PO Mapping with appropriate examples. The notion of 'Action Verbs' and some ways of indirect assessments were also deliberated upon.

DAY-2: 15.07.2021 Lecture 1: Outcome-Based Curriculum Design – Dr. B. K. Sarkar

Dr. Sarkar shaded lights on designing Outcome-Based Curriculum and shared some first-hand empirical evidences gathered in his professional life. Following the accreditation parameters proposed by NAAC, this lecture tried to enlighten the participants regarding Teaching-Learning process, Academic Audit and CO PO Mapping. Some related issues such as students' placement, skill enhancement, utilization of ICT facility in Teaching-Learning process were also discussed. Dr. Sarkar elaborately demonstrated the procedure of CO PO attainment-related calculations based on Revised Bloom's Taxonomy.

Expert-Participants Interactions during the Technical Sessions

Although after each session there was a declared time slot for Question and Answer session which were conducted by assigned members of IQAC of the College, experts were kind enough by extending opportunities for participants to broach their doubts and place their questions directly to them during the session itself. Truly the lectures were interactive in every sense of the term.



Total 152 feedback responses were received. 

On 9th June 2022 Department of Botany, ABN Seal College had arranged AJC Bose Memorial Lecture on "Think Outside the Box. Be an Entrepreneur!" The Speaker of this lecture was Prof. Krishnendu Acharya, Department of Botany, University of Calcutta. The lecture was arranged in online platform via Google meet from 11 AM to 1.30 PM. Total 90 participants had joined this online lecture given by Prof. Acharya. The main focus of arranging this kind of memorial lecture is to distribute awareness among the students, their understanding about how can we use our knowledge in practical aspect i.e. to use their knowledge to utilize their everyday waste product (which we say so but actually not) into creating purposes. The students' interaction with the eminent speakers, their queries in multiple directions, their eagerness to know outside of their knowledge etc. In this memorial lecture Prof. Acharya was speaking about how do we create our own instruments with our everyday use products with a minimum costs than the costs we bought them from the market. Moreover he also told about components of organic farming along with his own innovative. The useful aspects of farming and to make the farmers aware about their components which they bought from the market at very high costs. He also mentioned about cheaper and effective biofertilizers and green manuaring which farmers can use for their crops and which was also safe and very effective for their productions. The students were much enriched with his enormous knowledge and also they gained a lot from this lecture. Some students were very touched with this knowledge that they told Prof. Acharya that they are willing to take this part of lecture as their future project. 



Figure: Snapshot with respect to AJC BOSE Memorial Lecture 2021-2022


Report on One –Day National Webinar on "Incidence & Abatement of Corruption in Development Economics" organised by Department of Economics, Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal College, Cooch Behar, West Bengal :736101 on 13th June, 2022 (3 p.m. to 4-30 p.m.)

Corruption has been around for a very long time and will be around in the future unless governments can figure out effective ways to combat it. This is not going to be easy. Although the study of the causes and consequences of corruption has a long history in economics related empirical work on quantifying the extent of corruption and its economic effects has been limited.

As a result of wide publicity surrounding the statements at the multinational financial institutions' 1996 Annual Meetings by the Managing Director of the International Monetary Fund that governments must demonstrate their intolerance for corruption in all its forms and by the President of the World Bank that the "cancer of corruption" must be dealt with have stimulated renewed interest in the topic. Researchers have begun to look at so-called corruption indices, which are produced by private rating agencies and are typically based on replies by consultants living in the countries to standardized questionnaires


Researchers have begun to look at so-called corruption indices, which are produced by private rating agencies and are typically based on replies by consultants living in the countries to standardized questionnaires. As a matter of fact, corruption badly affects distribution of income and wealth, education and health care system, may leads to monopolistic system, provides disincentive for innovation and thereby affecting growth rate of the economy. It is therefore important in analyzing the relationship between perceived corruption and economic variables in order to infer the extent of adverse effects of corruption in a system.

In this backdrop, a national level webinar titled 'Incidence & Abatement of Corruption in Development Economics' was organized by Department of Economics, A.B.N. Seal College on 13th June, 2022. It was held via Google Meet platform, students and faculty members of Economics attended the webinar. The webinar commenced at 3p.m. Dr. Joyjit Dhar, Head of the Department of Economics welcomed the august gathering and also the distinguished speaker of the day. Revered Principal of the College Dr. Nilay Ray inaugurated the seminar and delivered the inaugural speech. In his inaugural speech, Dr. Ray pointed out the rationale of organizing such webinar lucidly so that the heterogeneous participants can understand and take part in deliberations in the following technical session. At the beginning of the technical session, Mr. Kunal Naskar, Assistant Professor in Economics of this Department introduced the eminent speaker of the day Dr. Amit K. Biswas Associate Professor in Economics in Visva- Bharati University, West Bengal, India. A few sentences about Dr. Biswas will speak for his efficiency and novelty in the relevant field:



Dr. Amit K. Biswas teaches Economics at Visva-Bharati for last 18 years after serving Panskura college for 2 years. An associate professor since 2014, he did his PhD from CSSSC, Kolkata as UGC research fellow in International economics under Prof. Sugata Marjit. He did his post-doctoral studies from Technological University of Dresden, Germany as prestigious Alexander von Humboldt fellow from 2008 – 2011. He also taught Economics at TU-Dresden and University of Bonn between 2009 – 2011, 2014 & 2016 - 19. Presently he is running a big project for the Humboldt foundation, sponsored by Ministry of Education & Research, government of Germany, in collaboration with University of Bonn that deals with trade, corruption and capital movement. He has published in top international economic journals. His present area of research includes international economics, environment & public policies, economics of corruption etc.

In delivering his lecture Dr. Biswas pointed out that in an corrupt economy resources are inefficiently allocated and companies with the help of bribe get the govt. contracts that otherwise would not have been granted. Corruption can lead to uneven distribution of wealth. Besides, the quality of education and health care facilities also deteriorates in a corrupt economy which in turn leads to a lower standard of living for the concerned economy. He also focussed in detail the Corruption Perception Index and inferred that emerging market economies tend to have much higher corruption levels compared to developed economies. He also stressed upon the relation between corruption and economic development and finally concluded the lecture by articulating the policy implications.



In the end; there was a very good question-answer round which clarified many doubts of the audience regarding the webinar. The webinar ended at 4-30 p.m. with the vote of thanks by Prof. Dilip Kumar Das, Associate Professor of Economics of the Department.






Webinar on "The Victorian Literature and Society" on 25.06.2022

One Day Seminar on "Application of RS & GIS in Academic Research organized by the Department of Geography on 22.02.2022



Title: "Extermalities in Coloring and distance constrained in Graphs"



The fourth S. Ramanujan memorial lecture was entrusted upon the Department of Mathematics to organize the same and give a befitting tribute to the great but noble soul who had contributed immensely towards the development of Mathematics. This year the topic of our student lecture was "Extermalities in Coloring and distance constrained in Graphs", it was delivered by Dr. Usnish Sarkar, of Netaji Subhas Open University. The intuitive idea behind the coloring of a graph is simply paint its vertices such that no two adjacent vertices have same color. What is the minimum number of colors necessary? This constitutes a coloring problem. After the vertices have been painted, they can be categorized into the groups or its; for example, one set having all the blue colors, another of red and so forth. This is a partitioning problem. The coloring and partitioning can either be carried out on vertices or on edges of the graph and for planer graphs; these can be performed in the regions. Coloring and petitioning have several important applications such as; coding theory, partitioning of logic in digital computer, scheduling and assignments etc.

Based on this the speaker presented a simple but nonetheless very interesting lecture on 4-colour theorem and other related problems. The lecture was mainly aimed at attracting the young minds on the importance of simple laws in Graph Coloring problem, such as the famous Face-Value law, in applications such as studying transportation problem etc., and thus highlights its applicability in higher learning and research. It was really a (very) thought provoking lecture and the students listened and paid all attention to the lecture given. A total 70 participants, including 65 students take part in the lecture.



College, Cooch Behar in Collaboration with the West Bengal Biodiversity Board

1. About the Institution and the Department:

Acharya Borjendra Nath Seal College (A. B. N. Seal College) was established in 1888 by Maharaja Nripendra Narayan as the erstwhile Victoria College; the institution was the pioneer of higher education in the princely state of Cooch Behar. Later, the Institution flourished under the leadership of renowned philosopher and educationist Acharya Brojendra Nath Seal. In 1970, the college came under the Government of West Bengal. The Department of Zoology started its journey in the year 1982. The Honours and Post Graduation courses were introduced under the University of North Bengal in 1988 and 2006, respectively. Since 2016, this college is affiliated to the Cooch Behar Panchanan Barma University.

2. Background:

A. B. N. Seal College frequently organises seminars, workshops, webinars, etc. as a part of extended academic activities. The college is situated in the heart of the city Cooch Behar, which is located in the northeastern part of the state and the city itself forms part of the Himalayan Terai of West Bengal. The location is adjacent to the Doors region, which is rich in its biodiversity resources. In the present scenario of worldwide biodiversity loss due to population explosion and climate change biodiversity remains the answer to several sustainable development challenges. In the scenario of International Day for Biological Diversity 2022, the Post Graduate Department of Zoology, A. B. N. Seal College, Cooch Behar expressed its willingness to conduct a one-day long level two-day long seminar on biodiversity in collaboration with the West Bengal Biodiversity Board. Report on Departmental Memorial Lecture, 2022

Vision:

About the Departmental Memorial Lecture:

The Departmental Memorial Lecture was organised on 30th June, 2022 from 6.45. P. M. to 8.15. P. M. (1 hour 30 minutes) via online mode on the occasion of Har Gobind Kohorana's birth centenary to impart our great respect and pay homage to this super-sized iconic Indian-born U. S. biochemist. Born on the 9th of January, 1922 (in Raipur, Punjab, under the Rule of British India), Har Gobind Khorana was one of the first scientists to demonstrate the role of nucleotides in protein synthesis and helped crack the enigmas of genetic code. He also contributed to develop custom-designed pieces of artificial genes and methods that anticipated the invention of the polymerase chain reaction (PCR) process, a biochemical technology used to amplify a single or a few copies of a piece of DNA. In 1968 Khorana was awarded the Nobel Prize for Physiology or Medicine together with Marshall Warren Nirenberg of Cornell University and Robert William Holley of the National Institutes of Health. In 1970, he prepared the first artificial copy of a yeast gene.

The associated persons of the memorial lecture were welcomed by the Head of the Department followed by the Principal's address and speaker's lecture.

About the Speaker and his Topic:

To enlighten our audience with a significant deliberation on this occasion, we had amongst us, Dr. Samiran Ghosh, Associate Professor from the Department of Zoology, Bethune College, Kolkata, whose contribution to this Department as a student and former faculty, when remained posted at this College, will always be remarkable. Dr. Ghosh spoke on the issue 'Genetic Association of Complex Traits'.

About the Patron and the Advisors:


